

## Choosing your Harlaxton courses Spring 2020

When studying at Harlaxton you must enrol on a **minimum of 12 credits** of study.

**British Studies (6 credits)** is mandatory and all students are required to take this. Lectures take place on Monday and Wednesday 8.30 – 9.30 am and seminars follow either at 9.40 am or 11 am. No other classes take place at these times.

At least **two** other courses must therefore be chosen. These are listed under Course Descriptions. Unless otherwise indicated these are **3 credit** courses.

Course are grouped together in blocks, all courses in a block being scheduled at the same time.

To avoid timetable clashes you may chose only **ONE course from any one block**.

The chart below shows the days and times when groups of courses are scheduled – remember, you may choose just one course from any individual block.
